

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS

This chapter is the last chapter. In this chapter the writer is going to present the conclusion of this study. The writer also gives some suggestions for the next researchers.

A. Conclusion

Based on the findings and analysis from the chapter IV, it can be shown that there are 49 compound words which are categorized into three types: compound noun 29 data, compound adjective 14 data and compound verb 6 data. Compound noun can be formed by the formulation Noun-Noun (NN), Verb-Noun (VN), Adjective-Noun (AN) and Adverb-Preposition (AdvP). Compound adjective can be composed by the formulation Adjective-Adjective (AA), Noun-Adjective (NA) and Adverb-Adjective (AdvA). While, compound verb can be formed by the formulation Verb-Verb (VV), Preposition-Verb (PV), and Verb-Noun (VN). Therefore, compound noun is the most dominant of compound words which are found on English translation of surah Al-Baqarah translated by Abdullah Yusuf Ali using McCarthy's theory about types of compound word and O'Grady's theory about structure of compound word. Most of compound words found are written with a hyphen.

B. Suggestions

In this sub chapter, the writer would like to give some suggestions for the next researchers to deeply extend the topic of the research on compound words concept. In fact, it is very important to understand about words and its form, because sometimes compound words are rarely found. Moreover, for the next researchers who are interested in word formation especially compounding, it is good to analyze another interesting terms, especially in spoken language such as song, speech, dialogue and movie, in order to enrich the knowledge about compound words.
